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

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
Total Claim Numbers



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
Total Claim Payments

Nominal Insurer (NI)

- NI claims represent around 0.1% licensed insurer claims
- Average of 6.9 claims per annum 1990-2008
- Average claim size by accident year \$60K 1990-2008
- NI made a 3 calls totaling \$0.9m in 2008-09



Return to Work (RTW) Outcomes

Tasmania has good RTW performance

- 2008-09 RTW rate 91% (83% nationally)
- Durable RTW rate 80% (72% nationally)

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 Tasmania performing better than national average in the following areas:

RTW measure	Tasmania	National
Mean length of durable RTW	161 days	141 days
Full RTW (employment as the only source of income seven to nine months after making their claim)	66%	59%
Management help in RTW (mean rating out of 5)	3.8	3.6
Ease of putting in a claim (simple)	80%	74%
Development of a RTW plan	59%	53%
Who helped to follow RTW plan: Insurer	6%	4%
In helping to RTW, most assistance: Rehab provider	14%	7%
Helpfulness of people in RTW: Work rehabilitation coordinator (mean rating out of 5)	4.0	3.8
Helpfulness of people in RTW: Employer (mean rating out of 5)	3.7	3.6
Compensation payment status seven to nine months after making their claim	15%	23%
Participation in rehabilitation	56%	46%
