






#### Recommended premium rates


Theories about economic pressures on the workers' compensation system

#### **Employment and claims decrease**



# ... so do incidence rates (except mining)






#### Claim payments increase

#### ... partly due to medical costs





#### **Legislative Review**

- 1. Create an improved structure for the Act, to enhance the readability and consistency of the legislation.
- Improve the efficiency of the legislation to respond to changing circumstances.
- 3. Address legislative anomalies and technical issues
- 4. Consider specific policy issues: age, common law safety net, insurance ambiguities, medical assessment, dispute resolution

Review on track to report by end December



#### Age

- Increase in number of workers continuing beyond retirement
- All states except Queensland limit entitlements for workers based on age or retirement status
- In WA, weekly benefits limited to 1 year for workers aged 64+; medical and other benefits not limited
- Options:
  - Maintain limits
  - Remove limitations
  - Increase age threshold or link to aged pension (67 or 70 years)
