Stronger Super is the biggest change in 20 years since superannuation became compulsory and has overhauled the governance required around managing a super fund. In particular, new requirements to strengthen risk management (SPS220), enhance the financial management of DB funds (SPS160), and hold capital against operational risk (SPS114) have been in place since 1 July 2013.

This session explores some considerations for trustees wanting to ensure the recent changes are linked together to deliver practical changes that ultimately benefit outcomes for their members.
