Phil's interest in spreadsheets dates back to the days immediately after his qualification as an actuary in 1989, when he was the sole technical actuary in a small life office. Over the last 30 years, he has designed countless spreadsheets of his own, and worked with others designed by fellow professionals. He is the author of a commercially available training course on "reliable spreadsheet development", aimed to help actuaries and other professionals build spreadsheets that will minimise risk and maximise the gains for the developers and for later users.
