International Actuarial Association (IAA)


- Created in 1895 as an association of 'individual members'
- ► Re-founded in 1995: IAA became an association of actuarial organizations
- ► Not-for-profit, Non-political, Non-Governmental Organisation
- Classification of members
 - ▶ 67 Full Member Associations
 - ▶ 29 Associate Member Organizations
 - ► Institutional members (IASB, OECD, ISSA, IOPS,ILO)
 - ► Observer members (1; Asian Development Bank)
 - Benefactor members
- ► Total of approx. 74 000 Associates and Fellows Approx. 800 volunteers scattered all over the planet




AWB—Mission

- ► Provide volunteer based actuarial services on **temporary** basis to assist in development and management of Social Security, ERM, pensions, health care, insurance, investments etc.
- Focus on geographic areas where there is a lack of actuarial resources
- ► Focus on situations where there are deserving needs among public entities, governmental organizations and social organizations including NGOs that lack actuarial resources
- ► Focus on support, advise and education
- ▶ Does NOT provide direct actuarial services on a consulting basis

AWB—Structure




AWB—Types of Projects
